### The Organization

- Coordinate the quantitative and qualitative research for Technical Programs and Research, Public Affairs and Government Relations and Communications and Marketing Departments.
- Responds to enquiries from member municipalities, public/private sector on information requests, and matters relating to municipal transportation and infrastructure.
- Represents Good Roads positively with municipal members, government and other agencies.
- Coordinates OPS specialty committee meetings, information, member activities, and work schedules.

- Provides secretariat support to Ontario Provincial Standards specialty committees and other OPS members.
- Sets priorities for standard reviews and develop work plans for OPS specialty committees, direct work of developing and maintaining OPS standards, organize and arrange standards for review and publication.
- Investigates and researches data for the development, review and maintenance of Ontario Provincial Standards.
- Fosters communications and liaison between OPS specialty committees, other OPS committees, MTO staff and Good Roads and MEA members, OPS stakeholders, and other OPS staff regarding standards, presentations, and committee activities.
- Responds to inquiries and comments regarding the Ontario Provincial Standards and advises stakeholders on OPS format, policies, and procedures.
- Maintains consistency between OPS construction and material specifications and OPS drawings with external and industry standards.
- Manages files and backup data from standard reviews and development.
- Promotes the use of OPS as a standard for MTO and municipalities.
- Represent OPS on external and internal technical and functional committees and task groups.
- Forward-thinker who can collaborate well with Good Roads partners, while investigating new or future opportunities for Good Roads and its progressive road initiatives.
