Responsibilities

- General operations of the Infrastructure Services Business Unit during the winter season including salt and sand application and snow removal with snow removing vehicles and equipment
- Road and equipment operations and maintenance, operating light and heavy equipment, and following all safety procedures, legislation, and Town policies
- Operate an articulated loader during winter control operations
- Maintain proper written or electronic records of activities as required by Ontario Regulations and internal policies and / or procedures
- Ensure safe and efficient operation, care and maintenance of tools, equipment and vehicles and perform daily checks on vehicles and equipment
- Maintain a safe work environment by taking necessary precautions and applying safety procedures in accordance with health and safety legislation and Town policies

POSITION REQUIREMENTS

- Completion of a Secondary School Diploma or equivalent.
- Valid Ontario Class "D" Driver's License with "Z" endorsement in good standing.
- Must have a working knowledge with winter control operations including but not limited to salting, loading snow, snow plowing; snow fighter training is an asset.
- Ability to operate a grader, or willingness to learn.
- Proven ability to operate single or tandem trucks with attachments such as salt and sand spreader, snowplow equipment, 4-wheel drive front-end loader, motor grader, and tractor.
- Completed courses from T.J Mahony Road School and/or C.S Anderson Road School preferred.
- Training in Transportation of Dangerous Goods, traffic control certification, chain saw operation, and confined space entry considered assets.

- Solid knowledge of road construction and maintenance, equipment operation, public works best practices, and applicable legislation (Minimum Maintenance Standards, MECP/MTO regulations).
- Working knowledge of all Occupational Health and Safety and Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System regulations.
- Ability to interpret construction drawings and work outdoors in various weather conditions and outside regular hours.
- Criminal Record Check and Driver's Abstract required.

WORKING CONDITIONS AND ENVIRONMENT

- Must be capable of reporting to town hall within 45 minutes of a callout;
- Overtime may be required as per operational needs;
- Working conditions may involve exposure to inclement weather;
- Physical demands include standing, sitting, and walking on construction sites with a need for visual attention to comply with health and safety regulations. Physical dexterity is necessary for tasks such as bending and minimal lifting;

Hours of Work: 12-Hour Continental Shift Schedule

Rate of Pay: \$32.51 per hour

Shift Information: Winter Operators will work on a rotating 12-hour continental shift schedule designed to ensure continuous coverage and operational readiness throughout the winter season. The schedule may include a **day, afternoon, evening, or night shift**, and will follow an alternating cycle to balance workload and rest. Shift times may vary slightly depending on operational needs or weather conditions. On-call duties may be required.

Length of Seasonal Contract: Seasonal positions will typically commence mid-November 2025 through to April 2026.
